RESIDENTS ARE REMINDED TO CUT CARD BOARD INTO 2' 6'' WIDTHS IF POSSIBLE SO THE RECY-CLING COMPANY CAN FIT IT INTO THE TRUCK. YOU NEED TO BREAK THE BOXES DOWN, REMOVE ANY NON RECYCLABLE GOODS, AND PROPERLY DISPOSE IN PROPERLY TAGGED BAGS.

LAWN TREATMENT PROGRAM

- **EARLY SPRING:** YOUR LAWN NEEDS EXTRA NUTRI-ENTS TO MAINTAIN COLOR AND DENSITY. AT THIS TIME YOU NEED TO APPLY A QUICK RELEASE FERTI-LIZER. NOW IS ALSO A GREAT TIME FOR SPRING MAINTENANCE.
- SPRING: WITH THE WEATHER TURNING WARMER APPLY A SLOW RELEASE FERTILIZER THAT PRE-PARES YOUR LAWN FOR SUMMER. APPLY A PRE-VENTATIVE CRABGRASS CONTROL AT THIS TIME. RULE OF THUMB FOR TIMING: APPLY CRABGRASS PREVENTATIVE BEFORE FORSYTHIA BLOSSOMS FALL.
- EARLY SUMMER : GRUB CONTROL/INSECT CON-TROL IS APPLIED, GIVING SEASON-LONG CONTROL AGAINST GRUBS AND THE DAMAGE THEY CAUSE. GRUB CONTROL IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED TO KEEP YOUR LAWN HEALTHY.
- SUMMER: SUMMER CONDITIONS CAN STRESS YOUR LAWN. TO PREPARE FOR THE WARM SEASON AHEAD, FERTILIZE, LOOK FOR PROBLEMS AND TREAT WEEDS AS NECESSARY. REMEMBER TO WA-TER, PREFERABLY IN THE EARLY MORNING. TIP: SET OUT A TUNA CAN TO COLLECT THE SPRINKLER WATER, AND TIME, ONCE YOU REACH AN INCH OF WATER IN THE CAN, THAT GIVE YOU THE AMOUNT OF TIME TO SET YOUR SPRINKLER TO GIVE ADE-QUATE WATER FOR YOUR LAWN.
- LATE SUMMER: CARE NEEDS CONTINUE WITH A FERTILIZER APPLICATION THAT HELPS MAINTAIN COLOR WITHOUT ENCOURAGING EXCESS GROWTH. TREAT WEEDS IF NECESSARY, AND IF GRUBS ARE PRESENT ANOTHER APPLICATION OF GRUB CONTROL WILL HELP.
- **EARLY FALL**: YOUR LAWN NEEDS HELP REBOUND-ING FROM SUMMER STRESS. APPLY A FALL FERTI-LIZER AND NOW IS A GREAT TIME TO AERATE YOUR LAWN AND SEED ANY BARE AREAS.
- LATE FALL: APPLY A LATE FALL/WINTER FERTILIZ-ER, LIME YOUR LAWN IF NEEDED ALL OF THIS AL-LOWS ROOT GROWTH AND FOOD STORAGE TO HELP YOUR LAWN SURVIVE DURING THE WINTER MONTHS.



How to Grow Grass in Sand or Gravel Conditions

SANDY, GRAVEL-FILLED SOIL, WHILE PROVIDING WELL-DRAINED, HEALTHY CONDITIONS FOR SOME PLANT LIFE, POSES DIFFICULTIES FOR GRASS GROWTH. GRASS TYPICALLY REQUIRES A HIGH LEVEL OF MOISTURE TO REMAIN LUSH AND VIGOR-OUS, AND NEITHER SAND NOR GRAVEL RETAIN WA-TER WELL. MOISTURE RUNS THROUGH THESE SOIL TYPES FASTER THAN OTHERS, AND THE FREQUENT WATERING THEY REQUIRE ALSO TENDS TO WASH AWAY NUTRIENTS. REGULAR AMENDMENTS TO SAND OR GRAVEL CONDITIONS CAN IMPROVE SOIL RETENTION AND ALLOW DROUGHT-TOLERANT GRASS VARIETIES TO FLOURISH. TO WATER WISELY AND ENCOURAGE DEEP ROOT GROWTH (TOO MUCH WATER MAKES THE GRASS ROOTS SHALLOW AND SUSCEPTIBLE TO DROUGHT SOONER) PUT YOUR SPRINKLER ON A TIMER, 10 OR 15 MINUTES VERY EARLY IN THE MORNING AND AGAIN IN THE EVENING.

VERY IMPORTANT

TO HOLD NUTRIENTS AND WATER IN THE ROOT ZONE OF YOUR NEW GRASS IT IS A MUST TO ADD ORGANIC MATTER. PEAT MOSS, COMPOSTED COW MANURE, ANY KIND OF COMPOST ALL ADD BITS AND PIECES TO THE SOIL SO IT CAN HOLD MOISTURE AND NUTRI-ENTS AT ROOT LEVEL. LAWNS NEED A FEED-ING SCHEDULE, ESPECIALLY IN SANDY SOIL CONDITIONS LIKE WE HAVE HERE AT FRIEND-LY VILLAGE. ASK AROUND THE COMMUNITY AND IF SOMEONE HAS A BEAUTIFUL LAWN, THEY WORK AT IT!

FATHER'S DAY WAS FOUNDED

ALTHOUGH SHE INITIALLY SUGGESTED JUNE 5, HER FATHER'S BIRTHDAY, THE PASTORS OF THE SPOKANE MINISTERI-AL ALLIANCE DID NOT HAVE ENOUGH TIME TO PREPARE THEIR SERMONS, AND THE CELEBRATION WAS DE-FERRED TO THE THIRD SUNDAY OF lunf -WIKIPEDIA




LEARN HOW TO INSPECT A MOBILE HOME: WHILE A HOMEOWN-ER INSPECTION SHOULD NEVER REPLACE A PROFESSIONAL INSPEC-TOR, IT IS SMART TO DO A REGULAR INSPECTION OF YOUR HOME. PROBLEM IS, MOST OF US DO NOT KNOW WHAT TO LOOK FOR OR KNOW WHEN SOMETHING SEEMS 'OFF.' HERE'S A QUICK LIST OF COMMON ISSUES YOU SHOULD LOOK FOR WHEN DOING A MOBILE HOME INSPECTION:

- ARE THE I-BEAMS BENT OR RUSTED?
- IS THE WOOD FLOOR FRAMING DAMAGED OR ROTTED?
- ARE THE MASONRY PIERS CRACKED, CHIPPED, OR OTHERWISE DAMAGED?
- ARE THE MASONRY PIERS IN CONTACT WITH THE STEEL FRAME?
- ARE THE MASONRY HOLES IN BLOCKS USED IN THE PIERS FACING UPWARD OR SIDEWAYS?
- ARE WOODEN WEDGES PRESENT BETWEEN THE PIER CAP AND THE STEEL FRAME?
- IS THERE PERIMETER BLOCKING LOCATED UNDERNEATH LARGE WALL OPENINGS SUCH AS SLIDING GLASS DOORS AND WINDOWS GREATER THAN 4' IN LENGTH?

2 LARGE HEADS ROMAINE LETTUCE 1/2 OF A MEDIUM RED ONION PEELED AND SLICED INTO VERY THIN RINGS 1/2 C. SLICED PEPPERONCINI RINGS 1/2 C. SLICED BLACK OLIVES 1/2 LB. PROVOLONE SLICED 1/8" THICK AND THEN CUT INTO 1/4" RIBBONS 1/2 LB. GOOD QUALITY SALAMI SLICED 1/8" THICK AND THEN CUT INTO 1/4" RIBBONS 12 OZ. CHERRY OR GRAPE TOMATOES SLICED IN HALF FRESHLY GROUND BLACK PEPPER KOSHER SALT IF NEEDED ITALIAN VINAIGRETTE



INSTRUCTIONS

For the lettuce, I like pieces that are manageable bite-wise. I don't want to also need a knife to eat my salad! So I first cut the romaine vertically two or three times, from the root end (don't cut all the way through the root, to keep the head intact) to the tips of the leaves. Then I make cuts crosswise, into 1/2'' to 3/4'' ribbons. Discard the root end.

TO ASSEMBLE THE SALAD: IN A LARGE BOWL, GENTLY FOLD TOGETHER RED ONION, PEPPERONCINI, BLACK OL-IVES, PROVOLONE, AND SALAMI. DRIZZLE ABOUT 1/2 CUP OF THE ITALIAN VINAIGRETTE OVER THESE INGREDI-ENTS, AND THEN GENTLY FOLD AGAIN.

ADD PREPARED LETTUCE AND TOMATOES, GENTLY FOLDING TO INCORPORATE.

TASTE FOR SEASONING AND ADD KOSHER SALT AND/OR MORE OF THE VINAIGRETTE, IF DESIRED. SPRINKLE FRESHLY GROUND BLACK PEPPER OVER THE TOP AND SERVE IMMEDIATELY.
