Time to start Lot clean up

We will be doing our annual lot inspections during May. Please check that your lot is in compliance with all community guidelines. Please bag leaves and needles in paper or regular bags so they can be easily lifted or carried by 1 person. No heavier than 50 pounds. If you have to drag it, it is too heavy. We need to lift the bags 4 ft to get them in the truck. Bags that are too full or heavy will *not* be picked up and must be re-bagged. No trash is to be inside leaf bags. Stack all branches & limbs by the roadside and we will pick them up, free of charge.

Roof Algae and Stain Removal

Have you ever noticed dark stains on your roof? It is most commonly called "roof mold," but it is actually algae that have formed on your roof due to dampness. The north side of homes is more likely to get algae stains since it receives less sunlight.

To prevent algae from forming on your shingles, you can use algae-proof shingles for your roof. If you don't need new shingles yet, but already have algae stains, you can use a cleaning solution such as hot water and soap or bleach.

Don't use a power washer to clean your roof! It can void warranties and ruin the granules on the shingles.



Fishing season is April 1-September 30 for Maine rivers, streams, and brooks. You might catch trout, togue, salmon, and/or bass. Be sure to be current with all fishing laws. The Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife website has a lot of great information about fishing in Maine. Otter Pond, in Standish, or Sticky River, in Standish, are a couple of local options for a family fishing trip. Always ask permission before going onto someone else's land.



Chicken Divan

Ingredients

1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
1 small yellow onion, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
2 large heads broccoli, cut into small florets, about 4 cups
3 cups diced cooked chicken
2 (10.5-oz) cans cream of chicken soup
1 cup milk
1 & 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar
Kosher salt
Freshly ground black pepper
1 cup panko breadcrumbs
1/4 cup freshly grated Parmesan
4 Tbsp. melted butter
Cooked pasta, such as egg noodles, for serving



Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 400°. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and cook until soft, 5 minutes. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute more. Add broccoli and cook until fork tender, about 5 minutes.

Step 2

Add chicken, cream of chicken soup, milk, and cheddar. Season with salt and pepper. Bring to a simmer and cook until warmed through, 5 minutes. Pour into a 9"-x-13" baking dish.

Step 3

In a medium bowl, combine panko, Parmesan, and melted butter. Sprinkle over casserole in an even layer and bake until mixture is bubbling and top is golden, 30 minutes.

Step 4

Serve warm over pasta.

Rent Payment Options

2. HOME AND LOT CARE/AESTHETIC STANDARDS



b) A homeowner must receive approval from the Community Owner in order to remove, relocate, erect, or build a shed, deck, awning, fence, lattice or to undertake masonry work, or to make any permanent or temporary addition or improvement to the home. Any change in exterior home color must be approved by community owner. All permanent changes to the lot will become the property of the community.



Annual Home Inspections

To keep your mobile home in good condition and maintain its value, prioritize regular inspections, focus on roof and siding maintenance, ensure proper foundation and skirting care, and address HVAC system and interior cleanliness

Exterior Maintenance

Conduct thorough inspections at least once a year, and more frequently after storms, to check for any signs of damage or issues.

Roof Maintenance:

Inspect the roof for damage, missing shingles, leaks, and debris in gutters. Consider resealing or recoating every few years, depending on the roof material.

Siding Maintenance:

Clean siding regularly with a gentle cleaner to remove dirt and grime.

Foundation and Skirting:

Ensure your home is properly leveled and that skirting is free of damage or gaps.

Ventilation:

Ensure proper ventilation of skirting to prevent moisture buildup and potential damage.
